



ABOUT THE VILLAGE OF DUNDEE

The Village of Dundee operates under a council-manager form of government, combining professional management with community-driven leadership. The elected Village Council sets the policies and vision for the community, while the Village Manager ensures the seamless implementation of these goals through day-to-day operations. This governance structure fosters collaboration, accountability, and efficiency, allowing the village to adapt and grow while preserving its welcoming, small-town charm. Dundee's vibrant community, with its historic downtown, thriving local businesses, and active residents, benefits from a system that prioritizes strategic decision-making and responsive service.

The Proposed Fiscal Year 2025/26 Budget submitted to the Dundee Village Council is balanced and sustainable, with healthy fund balances in all of the major operating funds. The Budget also recognizes the Village community and organization are at a critical period of transition. The Proposed Budget totals \$20,606,148, of which \$10,344,000 involves major infrastructure projects. Additionally, the Proposed Budget includes above-market compensation and benefits for the new Village Manager. Further, the Council will be considering filling vacant positions such as Finance Director, Village Engineer, and Community/Economic Development Director. The Proposed Budget also includes administrative positions to address recognized deficiencies.



ABOUT THE POSITION

Administration & Oversight

The Village Manager is the chief administrative officer for the Village of Dundee and is appointed by the Village Council.

It is their responsibility to carry out the policies established by the council. The Manager is also charged with the administrative direction of all village departments including, Assessing, Building, Engineering, Finance, Human Resources, Parks & Recreation, Planning & Zoning, Police Department, Public Works, Wastewater Treatment Plant, and Water Department. The Manager oversees and coordinates departmental functions and acts as a liaison between supervisory personnel and the council.

Duties

Managerial duties also include preparing the annual budget, overseeing the collective bargaining process, addressing the concerns of residents' and businesses, and developing solutions to the challenges that arise in the course of day-to-day operations.

The Village Manager undertakes special projects, reviews and responds to requests for service, and communicates with residents, businesses, the media, other municipal governments, and state and federal agencies. The village manager approves key purchases and is responsible for all personnel actions.

The duties of the Village Manager are further outlined in Division 2 of the Village of Dundee Code of Ordinances.

The filling of vacant positions is reflected in the proposed budget.

DRIVING INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRESS

In November 2024, Dundee residents approved a \$6 million Road Improvement Bond, marking a significant investment in the Village's infrastructure. The new Village Manager will oversee the implementation of this program, which includes major improvements to Dunham and Penfield Streets, as well as, related water, sewer, stormwater, and sidewalk upgrades. This highly visible project will have a large impact on the quality of life for all of the Dundee community. Additionally, the Village Manager will oversee seven capital improvement projects, bringing the total community investments to over \$10 million.

FOSTERING STABILITY AND TRUST


